- There is a surplus for the 9 months ended 31 May 2020 of £3k.
- Income has increased by £26k, £20k is due to the receipt of the final Living our Faith money from Portsmouth, an additional £5k of gift aid as an additional quarter was claimed this year.
- Planned giving and other offertory income is overall £2k down which represents the fall in loose plate when lockdown first hit but this has now picked up with the use of the Donate button on the website (Give as You Live).
- Expenditure is £18k down, with £13k less spent on church improvements and £7k on repairs.

The average monthly donation in the Parish using planned giving is currently £29. The standing order is the most preferred method of payment as it is the least administration for the Parish office and the number of parishioners giving this way has increased by 29%. The average monthly donation using direct debits is £30 (they range from £10 to £160 a month).

- A standing order is where you liaise with your Bank and you have control over the start and termination of the
 payment. You instruct your Bank to make a payment into the English Martyrs Bank account.
- A direct debit is organised through Portsmouth. Portsmouth takes the payment from your bank each month. Portsmouth make a payment of all the direct debits once a month into the English Martyrs Bank account.
- The Parish receives gift aid of an additional 25% if you are able to complete a declaration to say that you are a UK tax payer.
- Envelopes and the loose plate are no longer a practical way of giving during the coronavirus pandemic.

The parish appreciates all giving of whatever amount and whatever method suits parishioners best. During the pandemic, many parishioners have increased their giving or started up a new standing order and also used the Donate button on the parish website.

If any more parishioners are able to commit to standing order this would be very much appreciated. In addition, if you are a UK tax payer, please complete a gift aid form which generates an additional 25% for the Parish. All forms can be found on the Parish website.
