The Church's year is coming to an end with next Sunday's Feast of Christ the King being the final Sunday. The word of God has been highlighting the end times and the second coming of Christ. St Paul this Sunday speaks of the "Day of the Lord". "The Day of the Lord is going to come like a thief in the night". The early Christians lived in expectation of the imminent return of Christ. A spiritual benefit of the current coronavirus pandemic would be the development of a similar hope and expectation of the second coming of Christ as had the early Christians. I do not mean that we should be anxious or fearful, but, as St Paul tells us, "stay wide awake and sober!"

National Youth Sunday 2020 is Sunday 22nd November. A host of resources to facilitate the celebration of National Youth Sunday and the Feast of Christ the King can be accessed at www.nationalyouthsunday.com. The resources are split into categories; For Parish; For School; and For Family. They include Prayers of intercession, a Children's liturgy pack, and an excellent Family five minute video that encourages participation and reflection on the theme of togetherness – it is very definitely worth watching. Youth ministry teams and organisations throughout the country will lead a nine-day Novena to Christ the King starting on Friday 13th November. The Novena will be live on Instagram. The text will also be available on social media to pray the Novena at a time that suits. The Bishops of England and Wales also invite us to keep a vigil of prayer on the eve of the Feast of Christ the King. English Martyrs Church will be open for private prayer and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 7 pm until 9 pm on Saturday, 21 November. Bishop Philip invites us to keep 24 hours for the Lord on Fri November 27. English Martyrs will be open for private prayer and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 9 am until 6 pm and from 8 pm until 10 am on Saturday, 28 November. These opportunities for prayer are for the intention of an end to the pandemic. Let us pray our way through the pandemic and place our trust in the providence of God.


